**SUBJECT: REVOCATION OF OUTPATIENT
STATUS**

Individuals found innocent by reason of insanity and released from State Hospitals are monitored by the State Department of Mental Health Community Program. On occasion, these individuals may be out of compliance, in which case a Mental Health Professional from the Conditional Release Program (CONREP) will initiate a request for revocation of outpatient status. At this time, the individual is considered a danger to themselves or others while on outpatient status. Subsequently, a peace officer may be requested to take the individual into custody and book him or her into the Santa Clara County Main Jail for involuntary hospitalization under Penal Code section 1610. This is not a hold pursuant to 5150 W&I. The CONREP is located at 440 North First St, Suite 110, San Jose, CA 95112.

The procedure for booking these individuals are as follows:

- Upon the request from the CONREP director or designee, a peace officer shall take, or cause to be taken, the person into custody and transport the person to a facility designated by the community program director for confinement under this section (Santa Clara County Main Jail).
- The program director or designee will complete the form necessary to book the person and will provide it to the responding officer.
- The peace officer will complete a booking sheet reflecting the charge of PC 1610.
- At the time of booking, the officer will provide the Santa Clara County Main Jail with the form and the booking sheet.
- The individual is to remain in the officer's custody until successfully booked into jail.
 - For example, in the case that the individual is rejected at lower booking due to medical reasons, the person shall be treated as any other arrestee would. **The officer shall stay with the arrestee until successfully booked into the Santa Clara County Main Jail.**
